

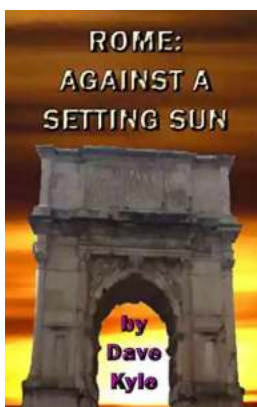

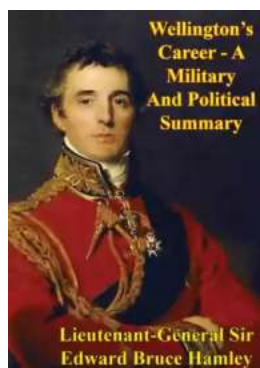

Worse, potential successors to Augustus die in turn, all in suspicious circumstances. Who is the serial killer? Lucius knows the answer, but he too is very close to death from cancer...
