



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A War Zone of the Soul



It is the beginning of a long journey home.



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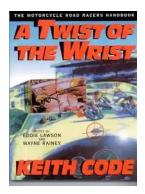
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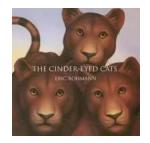
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
